

Syria, Hezbollah and Hamas Invade Israel on Nabka (Catastrophe) Day

People from Syria, Lebanon and Gaza invaded or attempted to invade Israel on Nabka Day. Nabka Day is the day that the State of Israel was established in 1948. However, this Nabka Day was a bit different than the past ones. Today saw a coordinated attempt to breach Israel's borders on three fronts: the Golan, Lebanon and Gaza.

On the [Golan](#) front

The incident began when approximately 1,000 people on the Syrian side ran towards the border earlier on Sunday. The closest home to the border in Majdal Shams is about thirty meters from the border with Syria. Some 150 Syrians infiltrated the border and entered the Druse village. One Syrian was killed and 30 or 40 were wounded in clashes which ensued with the IDF. The army stated that soldiers fired at protesters' legs, and said it was investigating how the infiltrators successfully crossed the border into Israel. The IDF detected Syrian military nearby, who were not preventing protesters from crossing the border. Col. Eshkol Shukran, commander of the Golan Regional Brigade was lightly injured by rocks thrown in the incident. Following the incident, IDF tanks and paratroopers were deployed throughout Majdal Shams. On the [Lebanon](#) front

Israeli army gunfire killed at least two and wounded over 10 others Sunday on the Lebanese side of the border as thousands of Palestinians gathered in Maroun al-Ras—one kilometer from the Israeli border—to mark the 1948 creation of Israel, officials said. The organizers of the rally told AFP that Hezbollah, which fought a bloody war against Israel in 2006, had financed the event.

Several dozen young demonstrators had managed to cross a Lebanese army cordon and massed near the border, shouting: "By our soul, our blood, we sacrifice ourselves for you, Palestine." Some threw stones towards the border, where Israeli soldiers were visible, an AFP correspondent said. (Edited for space.)

On the [Gaza](#) front:

In the Gaza Strip, hundreds of Palestinians threw rocks at Israeli soldiers at the Erez border crossing. A number of Palestinians were wounded when IDF soldiers dispersed the crowd. On Sunday afternoon, IDF forces fired on a suspect planting an explosive device along the border in the northern Gaza Strip. A hit was identified, the IDF said.

Analysis. The information points to the fact that this Nabka day was a coordinated attempt to invade Israel even if only for a few hours. The symbolism is obvious and so is the coordination. In Lebanon **The organizers of the rally told AFP that Hezbollah, which fought a bloody war against Israel in 2006, had financed the event.** Obviously nothing of this kind happens in Syria without government permission or organization. The same is true of the demonstrations at the Erez Crossing on the Israeli border with Gaza. Nothing happens there without the permission of Hamas.

I strongly suspect that this three-pronged attack on Israel was thought up by the respective groups. More likely it was part of a plan developed by the IRGC Qods Force operatives stationed in Syria. [Anti-Mullah](#) reports the following.

20,000 Iranian IRGC (Revolutionary Guards), GHODS (also Qods or Quds) (Special Forces) and Intelligence agents sent to keep "order" to Syria have so far murdered over 800 dissidents in just a matter of weeks and last week BEAT UP and ARRESTED some TEN THOUSAND Syrians with wide sweeps of the streets in the same fashion the Mullahs killed thousands of students in Iran's street protests in 2009.

What bothers me a bit is the somewhat lackadaisical reaction of the IDF to these occurrences. Both the *Jerusalem Post* and *Haaretz* are carrying articles critical of the IDF reaction especially to the events on the Golan. I must agree that the failure of the IDF and Israeli police to take stronger action quicker to repulse these invasions may give hope to Israel's enemies that Netanyahu has been neutered by the Obama administration as far as its reaction to attacks by its Muslim enemies. It would appear that Israel has become more bad press averse than before. This may bring Israel's enemies to the false, I hope, conclusion that Israel can be destroyed with little consequence to the invaders. Easy targets start wars. *The coming is Upon Us.*
